


Getting started with your Training

How do I access the online training?

Visit <https://training.scouts.com.au> through your internet browser. We recommend Firefox or Chrome. On demand learning can be used on smart phones and tablets.

To login:

- Select Branch as South Australia
- Enter your membership number
- Enter your password. If you have logged into training.scouts.com.au before, use that password

If you haven't logged in before, your initial password will be your date of birth in the format of dd/mm/yyyy

If you are unable to login or if you have forgotten your password, click the [Lost Password](#) button and follow the instructions.

How does the system work?

When you log in you will arrive at a page similar to the one on the right (Program Support Leaders will be taken to a page for Leader of Adults).

You need to complete the listed modules by clicking on each one and following the instructions on each page.

Each module is made up of a variety of media – some videos, some slide decks, some downloadable material. These need to be completed and a tick will then appear on the front page against the module.

You will not be able to proceed to the final quiz until you have clicked through the entirety of the module.

What are the mandatory modules?

As part of our ongoing commitment to Child Protection, Scouts SA and all other state branches have mandated completion of the National On Demand **Child Safe Scouting (SP CHLD)** and **WHS for Scouting (SP WHS)** modules as part of the proficiency training requirements for all adults.

This training must be completed within the first 3 months of joining. Once you have completed your modules you will only be required to renew your training every 2 years to maintain membership.

Failure to complete these modules before your 3-month period expires, or failure to renew the modules after 2 years will result in deregistration, at which point you will need to reapply for membership.

You can download an overview of the Leader Training Pathway [here](#). This download contains all the information required to understand your role's training requirements.

As a new Leader you need to obtain your **Certificate of Proficiency (CoP)** within 12 months. You will be listed as a trainee Leader until this is completed. If you don't complete your CoP within 12 months and have not officially applied for grace months, you will be reverted to an Adult Helper within your Section/Group, if you complete your training within a reasonable timeframe you will automatically be reinstated to your original appointment.

Who do I ask about content-related queries?

You can contact your Training Mentor – this may be your Group Leader or another Leader in your Group who holds a Wood Badge. Your mentor is the person you can ask questions of, seek advice and who can assist you in completing your In-service and Technical Skills that would have been explained to you during your initial interview.

When can I start wearing a uniform?

Scouts Australia Policy is that once you have been police checked and cleared, you can be invested (i.e. taken your Promise) and can wear the Australian Scout uniform. You can purchase your uniform from Exurbia once you have been police cleared by Scouts SA.

You will be classified as a Trainee Leader until you have completed your Certificate of Proficiency Training.

Does my training give me any formal qualification?

Leveraging the learning received from participation in the Scouts Australia Youth Program or Adult Training and Development, members of Scouting in Australia can use the Scouts Australia Institute of Training to gain vocational education and training (VET) outcomes including Units of Competency, Skill Sets and Qualifications. These VET outcomes are issued in accordance with the Australian Qualifications Framework and SAIT complies with the current Standards for Registered Training Organizations.

There is no compulsory alignment to VET qualifications as you progress through Adult Training and Development. VET qualifications are awarded by applying for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) supported by the Portfolio of Evidence (all attachments completed during training) that is assessed by SAIT Assessors.
