

## **Wood Badge Project**

All Leaders must complete a Wood Badge Project prior to receiving their Wood Beads and Gilwell Scarf. You can start your project at any time but most Leaders choose to start after enrolling into a Scouting Leadership Course.

Your task is to put together a survey of at least 10 open questions on a topic which is important to you. Some examples are:

- Scouts Owns and Ceremonies
- Expeditions, Camps & Sleepovers
- Adventurous Journeys
- Lightweight and Camp Cooking
- Promise and Law
- Achievement Pathways
- Outdoor Adventure Skills
- Special Interest Areas
- Diversity and Inclusion
- Linking between sections
- Youth member retention
- Promoting Scouting to the public
- Social Issues and Heath Awareness
- Risk Management and Activity Safety
- Safety issues around the Scout Hall

You then need to interview a cross section of people from different backgrounds such as youth members, other Leaders, parents, the public, etc. It can be conducted by face-to-face conversation, email, online tools such as survey monkey, video conferencing, or phone.

Some example questions that you could ask for a topic on Scouts Owns are:

- What is a Scouts Own?
- Why are Scouts Owns important to you?
- What part do Adults and Youth play in a Scouts Own respectively?
- Where can you do a Scouts Own?
- What are some memorable Scouts Owns that you have been involved in?
- Do you think Scouting conducts good Scouts Owns?
- How can Scouts Owns be linked to religion and spirituality?

From the information you collect, write a short report following this format:

- Describe your topic
- Summarise who you surveyed and the responses you received
- Discuss anything new you learnt about your topic or Scouting
- Analyse any differences between responses and why they were different (for example, did adults and youth have differing views)
- Reflect on what your results mean for Scouting and your own group
- Suggest practical recommendations related to your topic
- Detail what you might do differently in the future since completing the project

Your project will be discussed on the course, in your patrol. Please bring a copy of your report with you and be prepared to go into detail on what you discovered. If you need help getting started, please let us know!
